

CONFLICTING PERSPECTIVES:

MODERN CANADIAN IMPERIALISM IN GUATEMALA

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ABSTRACT

Indigenous communities in post-authoritarian states are actively resisting foreign-driven resource development on their territories. Resource companies are increasingly encroaching upon indigenous territories or indigenous peoples by global processes of globalisation, resources. Large-scale resource development is driven by the global economy. Indigenous rights are superseded by neoliberalism and democratisation, all of which affect local land, industry, investment and infrastructure. Economic policies prioritise development, leading to the displacement of people, with little regard for environmental sustainability. Previous review demonstrate that indigenous communities in Guatemala are demanding to be consulted prior to any development on their territories. As economic pursuits supersede indigenous rights in many post-authoritarian states, indigenous peoples are rarely consulted about resource development and, as a result, these peoples are increasingly resisting imposed development schemes on a worldwide scale.
